The more actively you participate, the better the decisions we will make.

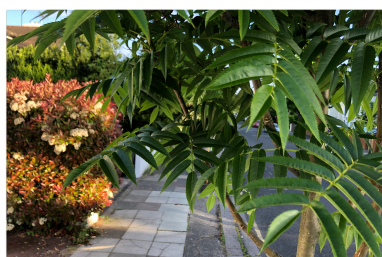


Levelling our Pavements
